



Drawing a roadmap for future transportation investments

The **Hualapai Moving Forward** program is already making high-impact, highly visible improvements to quality of life for future generations – everything from maintenance of Youth Camp Road to a new recreation park at Rodeo Circle.

But moving forward is about more than just building – it also means planning for the future. The Tribe will soon need your help developing a **Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)** and a **Transportation Asset Management Plan (TAMP)**.

The **LRTP** will serve as the Tribe's roadmap to strategically invest transportation dollars between now and 2045. Only projects identified in the LRTP and the Tribal Transportation Improvement Program are eligible for federal funding.

Separately, the **TAMP** will include strategies for maintaining existing assets such as road surfaces. The TAMP will also identify the requires workforce and skills needed to maintain the transportation system.
